I am sure that you will enjoy the latest edition of Bede's News, yet again jam-packed full of exciting pupils' achievements and many other items of interest. The College's theme of the week is the Holy Trinity. We have been asking our pupils to ponder upon "Is a family a community?". Everyone belongs to a family of one kind or another and Christians are all part of God's family. This Sunday's Gospel is about the Holy Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - who are a very special family and through baptism we enter into God's family. It is through Jesus that we can come to know the Father and we call upon the Holy Trinity when we make the sign of the cross. As scripture says: "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will lead you to complete truth" (John 16:13).

I hugely enjoyed my second storytelling "Jackanory" visit to our fantastic Prep School on Tuesday afternoon and it was wonderful to be able to read two stories with the pupils, featuring prominent leaders in black history. We were also able to discuss a number of important associated topics and I was very touched at the end of my visit when one of the Prep 4 pupils asked me "Can you come over to read often please?".



The College held a fantastic Mathemagic primary team challenge here on Wednesday and it was great to see our own Prep teams take part, as well as many other local schools. Many thanks to all of the staff and pupils who were involved, especially to the group of our Lower Sixth students who so willingly helped out.

We held the latest in our Alumni Lecture Series here at St Bede's last night with a talk from Professor Ronan O'Hora, a world-renowned expert in the field of piano and keyboard playing from the Guildhall in London. He also gave a series of masterclasses to pianists from both the Prep and the wider College and we are extremely grateful for his visit. We also held yesterday the first of our two Higher Education Days for the College's Lower Sixth students, with a wide variety of activities taking place for them as well as expert advice from external speakers. The second day will be taking place this Tuesday and I am very grateful to the Sixth Form team for putting together these incredibly valuable events for our students. This evening some of our U4 pupils are having a 'Sleep Out' to raise awareness for the homeless in Manchester, and we are currently hoping that the recent heavy rain will disappear!

We are very much looking forward to our annual Year 5 Taster Morning tomorrow and I cannot believe that it is already a year since our last one. I will be speaking to the parents present towards the end of the morning, and am very grateful to all of the pupils and my colleagues who are involved in the organisation and running of this important event.

Finally, it is my great pleasure to be hosting our Celebratory Dinner here at the College on Monday evening for our heroic U12 ESFA Cup winners and their parents, as well as their coaching team. Their collective achievement continues to be a source of great pride and inspiration to me, and I am delighted to be able to publically celebrate their success as well as enjoy this moment with their parents and my colleagues.




#### A Well-Travelled Library Book!

#### Can You Hear Us?



#### Girls' Football Bounces Back To Bede's!

St Bede's College and St Bede's Prep are delighted to announce that from September, we will see the exciting reintroduction of our girls' football programmes. With the women's game growing annually in both popularity and engagement, St Bede's will provide all of our girls with the opportunity to engage in the game and look to build on the College's footballing reputation. With the current coverage of the Women's World Cup breaking viewing records, we feel that this is a great time to re-launch our Girls' Programmes in September 2019.

Girls' football has already been running for four years as part of our Prep and College co-curricular schedule but from September, the programme will be become more formalised, focussing on developing skills as well as introducing competitive fixtures. Our current Prep provision already includes annual fixtures against King's Chester and a number of other schools. The Prep team also enter the prestigious AJIS tournament, which is held at St Bede's. Alongside the current provision the girls will compete in the Manchester Junior Schools League with fixtures taking place at Whalley Range High School on one Wednesday per month from September until March.

Within the College, teams from the Upper Third to the Upper Fourth have been entered in the Manchester Schools League. This may extend through to the Sixth form depending upon the popularity of the programme. Miss Claire Whitney will be overseeing the Girls' Football and she will be supported by a specialist football coach who will inspire the girls to improve their technical ability and apply their newly acquired skills to competitive games. With two current Old Bedians playing for England in France during the current World Cup, St Bede's will be looking to continue its international successes by developing the next Kiera Walsh or Georgia Stanway.

#### Mathemagic Primary Team Challenge 2019


