



Kilimanjaro Walk

At 1.45pm on Thursday the 20 June, a group of intrepid Upper Third students, ably led by Mr. Yates and Mr. Lee-Rodriguez, finally made the summit of the stairs of the Vaughan Building. The air may have been thin but the joy and relief on the faces of the ardent adventurers was capacious. Helping each other scramble over the last few stairs, Oliver Taylor stoically planted the Siena flag, atop the lofty peak; a victory for fortitude, team work and Bedian grit.

The team had previously spent three lunchtimes climbing the gruelling 107 steps, ascending 17 meters with each ascent. The team of ten climbers proceeded to climb the Vaughan stairs 30 times in roughly two hours, taking the entire total of the team to a height of 5100 metres (200 meters above the actual height of Kilimanjaro but lack of oxygen at the summit has been blamed for this).

To date, the climbers have raised a total of £160 for the Siena House Charity, The Cindy Appleyard Foundation, but more than that, they learned that through cooperation, resilience and perseverance, any peak can be conquered – imaginary or not!
