The Headmaster's Review of the Week

Dear Bedian Family,

This Sunday (1st December) is the first Sunday of Advent, which is also the first Sunday of a new liturgical year for the Church. "Advent" is derived from Latin and means the arrival of a notable person or thing. The Advent season includes the four Sundays that precede Christmas. It is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord. In this season, we recall two central elements of our faith: the final coming of the Lord in glory and the incarnation of the Lord in the birth of Jesus. Key themes of the Advent season are watchful waiting, preparation, and justice. This introduction to my review of the week has been taken directly from my address to all College pupils on Wednesday of this week, which I was able to deliver by holding three back-to-back assemblies in the Academic Hall. It was very special and important for me to be able to pray with our pupils and my colleagues, and to be also able to tell them a story which concluded with the following advice



- "No matter how much the world tries to hold you back, always continue with the belief that what you want to achieve is possible. Believing you can improve and grow stronger is the most important step in actually achieving it".

Our College Mass for staff on Tuesday lunchtime, celebrated by Fr. Dearman, was again extremely well attended by a wide range of colleagues and many of us were also able to participate fully in the Holy Mass by saying the readings, delivering the gifts and reading the bidding prayers. Attending Mass at the College continues to be one of the many highlights of my week here at St Bede's and I am so fortunate to have such a wonderful Chapel on site at which to pray and go to Mass.

We held our inaugural GCSE information evening for Year 11 pupils and their families in the Academic hall on Wednesday, covering a wide range of important matters such as how to plan effective revision, the importance of preparation, how to most effectively manage exam stress and the format of the forthcoming mocks. I concluded the event by emphasising that a huge array of academic and pastoral support is available at the College for our pupils and I encouraged them to always let us know when they are finding any aspects of their lives difficult. St Bede's is such an amazing school, in large part because of how committed we all are within the Bedian family to the support and development of our fantastic and inspiring pupils.

Our Upper Third retreat to Castlerigg has been a superb success again this year and it has been wonderful to hear from the pupils involved how much fun and spiritual inspiration they have experienced upon the trip. I would like to thank all of my colleagues who took part in the retreat and look forward to attending next year's one.

I am really excited about attending my first St Bede's College Christmas Fair tomorrow morning and the Academic Hall downstairs has been a hive of activity for many hours. Thank you to the great many pupils, colleagues, parents and other volunteers who year in, year out help to run and support this invaluable event.





House Christmas Card Competition 2019

With the overall winner being Faith D from Siena House.



Football Update

King's Chester Block

On Saturday the U12's recorded a superb away win against King's Chester. Nna gave St Bede's the lead before King's Chester hit back with two of their own. This did not dampen the U12's spirits and they went on to score two goals through Logan and Alfie to record a 3-2 win, with a man of the match performance from Cian. The U13's secured a 5-0 victory with goals from Tyreek (2) Benat (2) and an own goal. The U14's were involved in a thriller which saw the game tied at 4-4 with ten minutes to go. James C netted all of St Bede's goals, in what was an outstanding morning for the young striker. Unfortunately King's struck two late goals to record a 6-4 win. At home on the 1st XI pitch a tight game ensued, but King's managed to put their chances away with more clinical finishing to record a 3-1 win.

Cup update

On Thursday the U13's progressed to the fifth round of the ESFA Cup following a 3-2 victory over Poynton High School. The boys made a wonderful start and went two up with excellent finishes from Benat and Padraig. Poynton battled back and managed to score twice so it was we 2-2 at the break. Following a close second half, in which both teams created great chances, it would be St Bede's who produced a moment of quality with four minutes remaining. Padraig split the defence with a through ball that beat five defenders and Benat was on hand to slot home. On Tuesday the U15's were unfortunate to lose 1-0 to Wetherby in the fourth round of the ESFA Smalls Schools competition.

In the week ahead the U13's travel to Netherhall School on Monday to compete in the third round of the ESFA Small Schools Cup and the U14's have a slightly shorter trip down the road to MGS to compete in the second round of the Manchester Cup on Tuesday.

Careers Talk

On Wednesday 27 November two Bedian Alumni visited the Sixth Form to talk to students about their evolutionary careers and their current employer PA Consultancy.

Barbara Bradley - 1987-92, talked about how she initially completed a Psychology degree at Warwick University and went on to join the RAF and the GB rowing squad. However, after sustaining a major back injury she was unable to carry on with her military and sports career. So she joined IBM to train in business management and went on to oversee healthcare development programs in major prisons nationwide.

Finally, she joined PA Consultancy Group around 6 years ago. Shaun Delaney 1981 - 87, completed a Biochemistry degree at St Andrews University and then worked in the Manchester Royal Infirmary as a research scientist, but he was unfulfilled by his work. So he decided to work for a pharmaceutical company which worked with the government to order and supply medicine. Then 20 years ago he decided to work for PA Consultancy Group and he has worked his way up to a senior management position.

PA Consultancy Group is an international consultancy firm specialising in management consulting, technology and innovation. It works with companies in the private and public sector as well as national Governments. Both Barbara and Shaun work in the Public Sector Department of the firm. They work with public agencies and governments to create economic policies and find solutions to business problems. They collate research which they analyse and

interpret the data in order to come to the most suitable conclusions.

They talked about how rewarding their work is because they have a role in improving the country by participating in the creation of socioeconomic policies and technological solutions to improve industries and the standard of living.

Overall, they stressed the importance of choosing a degree that you are passionate about. They also emphasised the need to take time to find what you are passionate about and never be afraid to take opportunities. They said that the industry you start in, is not necessarily the industry you will retire in. When you change jobs to make sure you acquire new skills use the ones that you have already.

As interviewers at PA Consultancy they also divulged interview advice. For instance, you should try to compose a CV and cover story which doesn't just show your qualifications and skill set but also shows your personality and values. Employers like interviewees that have in-depth knowledge of their company and ethos to see if they will be an asset to it and enhance the environment.

Geology trip to Aquinas College

On the 26 of November 2019 St Bede's Geology department attended a Geology Lecture hosted by Aquinas College. The Lecture was delivered by Prof Phillip Manning, on the topic of 'The Last Days of the Dinosaurs'.

Professor Phillip Manning currently teaches at Manchester University where he is a Professor of Natural History. This topic was really captivating for the audience and the students of St Bede's who found it a really interesting topic to listen to. He spoke about new evidence found in North Dakota which details the final day the dinosaurs ruled the earth.

Some of the fossils here may even have remains of the actual meteorite that wiped them out stuck in their gills! This ground breaking location is going to be discussed in upcoming documentaries which Prof Manning is filming with the BBC, to be aired next summer.

The Geology Department would also like to invite others who are interested in joining us for our lecture on the 4 December, delivered by Prof Janine Kavanagh, a Senior Lecturer at The University of Liverpool.

The Lecture is free of charge, however, we will be collecting donations towards the Geology Department charity, The School Under the Tree.
