Whelan Continues Fine Form!

U15A won 5-1 against Bury GS Goals- G. Davies, M. Swanston-Nunes, B. Whelan x 3 MOM- Ben W

The sun was shining on Fortress Brantingham offering perfect playing conditions for the teams representing the College. The U15As carried on from where they left off and continued their dominance against a battling Bury Grammar School. The first fifteen mins of the match was a scrappy affair with neither team wanting to keep hold of the ball. G. Davies began to take control of the midfield and dictate proceedings, spraying the ball like a young Steven Gerrard and capped his first half performance with a sublime 40 yard strike making it 1-0 to SBC at half time.

The second half was dominated by SBC and pushed Bury into what can only be described as a back seven at times. SBC played some really nice football, being patient and waiting for the gaps to appear.



On the 60th min "Cometh the hour, Cometh B. Whelan" I am very lucky to witness two of the best goals I have ever seen at school boy football! Both times B. Whelan cutting in from the left with a drop of the shoulder and a change of pace, then unleashing two unstoppable strikes which were very Coutinho esque. Both strikes from 30+yards, the first one beating the keeper at his near post and the second the far post, both shots hit with venom and curve......unbelievable scenes. B.Whelan finished his hat trick scoring a well taken penalty. Bury grabbed one goal back from a good long range effort, but M. Swanston killed off any chance of a come back adding to the score finishing nicely on the edge of the box.

A well deserved victory played in the right manner. It was lovely to see all injured players along with their parents turn up to support the boys. This was a great result, ahead of the international break, which sees the U15s search for some fair weather during their Dubai training camp.

Block Fixture - Scarisbrick

On Saturday morning we welcomed Scarisbrick Hall to Brantingham Road for U12A and U14B fixtures. With the U12s registering an emphatic 5-1. In the first half we took control of the midfield with Nna and Noah dominating the ball and not allowing Scarisbrick any control of the game. Alfie stepped up as a 'keeper and made some comfortable saves to keep his confidence growing. Nna then took his chance and dribbled around five players to slot home and open the scoring. The U14Bs suffered a 2-0 defeat, however, we had a positive performance and it was a very competitive game. Unfortunately, we started slowly and went 1-0 after ten minutes. There were lots of improvements in the second half after a few tactical tweaks and a "passionate" half time team talk from Mr Wright. The U14s then dominated most of the second half reducing them to one shot which they unfortunately scored from. However, we continued to press and there was a clear increase in desire from the boys and we only lacked that end product to come away with a better result. The boys left the field with renewed confidence to take into games after the half term break.


