Podcast - Black History Month

On Friday 9 October, Isaiah (L5) and Roman (U4) were invited to the Etihad Stadium to take part in a Manchester City FC Podcast as part of Black History Month.

The Academy Students have been working on a project this half term researching all the Black and Mixed Race players who had represented Manchester City. The boys found 71 players beginning with Stan Horne in 1965 through to Zack Steffen in 2020 and created a playing card game with statistics from all the players.

Isaiah and Roman were interviewed about the project which is a celebration of Black History within the club and they learnt that Manchester City have players hailing from England, Germany, Belgium, Zimbabwe, Liberia, Cameroon, Costa Rica, Togo, USA, Ivory Coast, Nigeria and Jamaica. There were also four former Bedians amongst the celebration of Manchester City players. Both boys spoke eloquently and with maturity about other issues such as racism in sport and the prominence of role models for future generations.

Mr Woan who designed the project and attended the podcast said "All the students have worked brilliantly on this project and with passion and interest. I was immensely proud of Isaiah and Roman who were excellent during the podcast and were a credit to the College and their families".

There is no need to worry the historic whole school photographs have been safely stored and will be reinstalled once the works have been completed.






National Poetry Day

Alex Williams Assembly

Alex Williams MBE delivered assemblies to three year groups on Friday 16 October as part of Black History Month.

Alex, who represented Manchester City 125 times, was the club's first ever black goalkeeper and now operates as a City in the Community Ambassador.

For three decades, Alex has worked hard to change people's prejudices and has supported young Mancunians of all colours and religions.

In 2002, Alex received a MBE in the New Year's Honours list for his services to young people. Today, he delivered his anti-racism assemblies to nearly 300 Bedians as part of Black History Month.

Black History Month


For Black History month this year, Prep 6 have focused on British Black History which extends from the time of the Roman conquest when soldiers from North Africa invaded Britain in AD43 to the present day's Black Lives Matter and the protests over the death of George Floyd. Prep 6 have developed a timeline of all the key events over the last two thousand years. We have learnt many very interesting facts, such as a black trumpeter played at the court of Henry VII, that John Archer became the first black mayor of London in 1913 and that Jack London was the first black man to win Olympic medals for Great Britain. Black women had even greater hurdles to climb, including Mary Seacole who overcame racial prejudice to set up her own


hospital in Crimea whilst Lilian Bader became one of the first black British women to join the British Armed Forces in 1941. Pupils in Prep 6 have also researched 'Black Women Firsts' - amongst other key firsts, they learned that Diane Abbott was the first black female MP in the House of Commons, Phyllis Wheatley was the first black woman to publish a book and Halle Berry was the first black actress to win a 'Best Actress' Oscar.






