Oscar also received a special mention as he was the very first pupil to congratulate Mrs Pike on her new role at the beginning of the Academic Year!










Black History Month

Inzinga S-A - Upper Sixth




On Thursday the Sixth Form held an assembly led by students to celebrate Black History Month. We explored its origin and purpose and why it is important to recognise the contributions made by black people throughout history.

We learned about several key black figures: Mary Seacole was a prominent nurse for British soldiers during the Crimean War, but she is often forgotten in the shadow of Florence Nightingale. James Baldwin was an American novelist and playwright who raised awareness of racism and the lives of African-Americans under segregation through his work. Katherine Johnson, Dorothy Vaughan and Mary Jackson were mathematicians and astrophysicists working for NASA and who were vital to the American Space Race.

All of these people contributed hugely to human knowledge, culture and society and it is important that their stories and contributions are acknowledged and appreciated.

STEM - Tower Challenge

As part of their STEM engineering lessons Prep 5 have been investigating the surface of the Moon. They have been looking at safe places to land space craft and where a base could be built. This week they faced a challenge that featured on 'Astronauts Do You Have What It Takes?', which was won by Dr Susie Imber.

The challenge was to build the tallest tower possible. There were, however, certain rules; they could only use scarp paper, scissors, paper clips and Selloptape. Their tower had to be able to stand unaided; it could not be stuck to the table or floor.

The children worked together for fifteen minutes to come up with a design for their tower. They then had thirty minutes to construct it. Communication and teamwork were critical for the task to be successful. Also good foundations were essential for the tower to stand without falling which, at the last minute, some groups discovered they had not done.

There was a winner from 5J of 128cm and 5C 110cm. The most important lesson was each team worked together to solve a problem and between them they learned how to correct mistakes and improve their designs.









Leaf Man

Reception class have been enjoying the story of Leaf Man by Lois Ehlert. They used this story as part of our learning about the natural world around them.

They made an investigation area and used a light box to look closely at the different types of leaves that they found. Their homework task was to make their own 'Leaf Man' and they made wonderful creations. Well done Reception class, they are amazing!









Prep School

Black History Month

Throughout October, we will be recognising 'Black History Month', by learning more about important and influential people. It is important that all of our pupils have the opportunity to celebrate people in black history who have had a profound impact on our lives.

In Reception Class the children have been learning about Mary Seacole, known as 'Mother Seacole', alongside their topic of 'People Who Help Us'. They learned that Mary became a nurse winning medals for her bravery as she set up a field hospital in the Crimean War.

Prep 4 have been studying influential musicians; they have researched and listened to Ella Fitzgerald, Aretha Franklin, Bob Marley, Stormzy and Emilie Sande.

In Prep 5 the children have learned about the pioneering black footballers including Andrew Watson who captained Scotland to a 6-1 victory over England in 1881, Arthur Wharton who was the first black professional footballer in 1888.


The children have enjoyed learning about these wonderful people and sharing their insight and knowledge from their own experiences. Celebrating




