Wellbeing Challenge



Tony Hennigan September 1990 to December 2020

Before coming into Teaching, I spent five years as a Design Engineer working for GEC Switchgear, designing equipment for electrical sub stations which was exported all over the world. I decided to give it up to re-train as a Teacher. My first teaching position was at St Vincent De Paul in Victoria Park where I was quickly promoted to the Head of Department. St Bede's College had never taught Technology before and in the summer term of 1989 they appointed me as the new Head of Technology. I helped to set up the department from scratch and I spent the summer term working with the College Architect and the builders to set the department up ready to start teaching Technology in September 1990.

I have really enjoyed my time as the Head of Technology at the College, the department now teaches Technology from Prep 5 right through to A-Level. We are one of the very few Schools in the UK that is currently teaching students as young as 9 to operate a Laser Cutting machine. The department prides itself on the excellent examination results and the national awards that the students have won. These awards include the AQA A-Level Technology award which was won by Rachel when she beat over 31,000 other students for the best examination result in the UK. Other awards include the Roland Digital Creative Design Award and most recently the STEM Engineering and Bloodhound Engineering Awards.

As well as striving for excellent examination results, the department has always encouraged its students to solve real problems in the community and has linked up with several companies and organisations to work with its students on their coursework projects. Some of the highlights over the past thirty years included designing an interactive Electronic device for Manchester Children's hospital to calm young patients down whilst they were on the way to surgery. We also worked with Manchester City Football Club to design some batch produced Three-Dimensional promotional gifts for their souvenir shop as part of a GCSE Graphic Design project. The Manchester Giants Basketball team and the Manchester Storm Ice Hockey Team when they were based at the Manchester Evening News Arena also approached us to do some work with our A-Level students. The Rainbow Family Trust which is now Francis House Children's Hospice asked us to help them promote one of the charity shops and a group of U4 students created their own Radio Jingle which was played on the BBC. The Students also produced a Three-Dimensional sign and billboard.

I have been very lucky to have worked with a team of some of the best Technology Teachers and Technicians, not just in Manchester but in the UK and would like to thank them all for their loyal support to myself and the students.

Outside of my duties as Head of Technology I have always enjoyed raising money for charity and one of my first projects was to set us the One World CAFOD group to raise funds over a week-long festival of events. The yearly event would often raise between £6,000 and £10,000 for the charity. In 1995 I set up 'Young, Gifted and Green' which was an Irish, Music, Song and Dance Troupe which featured performers from the College and elsewhere. The group raised £216, 507.76 during its 25 years and the last concert was staged just before the lockdown in March at the College. The troupe have played several prestigious concerts which have included the BBC Proms at the Royal Festival Hall in London, staging our own sell out concerts at The Lowry Theatre, Gorton Monastery, The Bridgewater Hall, Manchester Town Hall and The Palace Nightclub.

The troupe also enjoyed appearances on local and national TV shows like the BBC Songs of Praise Show, BBC Blue Peter Show, ITV's Lets Dance series and the Irish Connection series as well as live performances on the BBC News, Granada TV News and Sky News.

What's Next?

Although I am retiring from teaching at St Bede's College, I have several projects lined up to keep me busy and occupied. As soon as the COVID-19 pandemic is over I plan to use my spare time travelling the world and enjoying my passions of outdoor swimming, cycling, walking, and gardening, as well as looking after my grandson. But to begin with I will be kept busy working part time with my brother's hospitality and building company on marketing, management, and landscaping projects. I will also be working with Tourism Ireland and Mayo County Council on some Tourism projects in Ireland and the UK as well as some other marketing and press work for various clients. 7 years ago, I set up the Mayo Manchester Tourism and Business group which has won several awards for its work promoting County Mayo in the West of Ireland and engaging with the 5 million people around the world who have links to the County.

Ross, at the centre, was close to tears when he saw the quality and volume of the donations and highlighted that for those living in isolation, alone or in poverty, this will really brighten their Christmas and asked for us to pass on huge thanks to everybody who donated.

I will echo that sentiment and say how proud I am to be a Bedian and to be a part of everything that entails. On behalf of the house team, Mr Lee-

Rodriguez (Siena), Mrs Barber, Mrs Hibbert (Lay Chaplain) and myself, thank you for supporting us this year so far and we hope that everybody has a wonderful and peaceful Christmas.

Football, Foden and Bede's

Fresh Base Productions visited St Bede's on Thursday morning as part of a full day of filming at venues across Manchester. The EA Sports project profiles the life of Bedian Phil Foden, from his roots in Stockport to his professional football career. Remote Learning

Blended Learning

Since September Sixth Form students self-isolating have benefitted from hybrid lessons with visualisers provided to all staff thanks to our active Parent Teacher Association. These allow students to share content and contribute to class discussion from home. In addition, they can submit work for feedback online – in many cases receiving this faster than if they had to physically hand in work!

Personal Support

Through the whole process, our small tutor groups have meant that personal development and career support has continued. We have held Parents Evenings remotely and even added extra sessions for exam feedback. We also provide specific support for those applying for subjects such as Medicine and to Oxford and Cambridge University – for example how to manage online interviews. Reports remain personalised and give specific feedback to students rather than just grades.


