Geology Lecture 2020

On Thursday 10 December, the Geology Department held their 25th anniversary Geology Christmas Lecture. On an evening of firsts, the lecture was delivered via ZOOM by a former pupil, Dr Matt Loader. While it was a shame not to hold the lecture in our academic hall over 60 people signed in to listen to Dr Loader's presentation focussed on Copper ore deposits and the increasing demand for copper as the world strives to produce more green energy. Dr Loader put this into context with some startling facts and figures about the amount of copper used in green energy production





and electric vehicles, an electric bus requires over 300kg of copper! The most viable reserves of copper are found close to the frozen magma systems of extinct volcanoes, hence the title of the lecture 'Can dead volcanoes save the world'. These are the types of copper deposits that Dr Loader specialises in and is currently involved in ground breaking research to find and exploit them. The mines made to extract these deposits are huge and lead to some of the world's largest holes in the ground. For example, the Bingham Canyon mine in Utah could easily fit the entire of Manchester within its walls.

Dr Loader's presentation reaffirmed the need for more geologists in the world, as we strive for a greener future in a more technologically advance world, natural resources hold the key, and it is geologists who are going to find them. The methods used to find these deposits and extract them safely are taught in both GCSE and A level Geology at St Bede's and hopefully one day in the future we will welcome back another former pupil to tell us how they are helping to save the world and secure a greener future for us all.








England Call Ups


